Make Your Donation Go 25% Further for Alderney Wildlife

As a small Alderney charity, the Alderney Wildlife Trust (AWT) is heavily dependent on the generosity of Bailiwick residents. They have helped to set up Alderney's Community Woodland, made the island's nature reserves possible, and even funded a boat for marine surveys.

To try and maximise the value of these donations, AWT is encouraging supporters to make the most of their charitable giving by taking advantage of tax relief available on donations of £500 or more.

By completing a simple form, donors can increase the value of their gift to our work studying, championing and protecting wildlife by 25%, at no extra cost to the donor.

As a registered charity, AWT is eligible under Guernsey's charitable donation scheme to reclaim tax on qualifying donations. This means that when an individual who pays Guernsey income tax donates £500 or more and completes the appropriate declaration, the Trust can claim back tax equivalent to 25% of the donation.

For example, a <u>donation</u> of £1,000 allows the Alderney Wildlife Trust to reclaim an additional £250, increasing the total value of the gift to £1,250 - significantly boosting support for wildlife conservation on the island.

Every donation to AWT helps protect Alderney's unique natural environment, supporting vital work including habitat conservation, species monitoring, education and community engagement. Tax-effective giving enables donors to maximise their impact while supporting causes close to home.

How the Tax Relief Works

- Donations must total £500 or more in a calendar year
- Donors must have paid sufficient Guernsey income tax
- A simple donor declaration form must be completed
- AWT then reclaims the tax directly, adding 25% to the donation

Donations can be made <u>online</u>, by bank transfer, cheque or in person. The Alderney Wildlife Trust team is happy to assist donors with guidance on eligibility and the declaration process.
